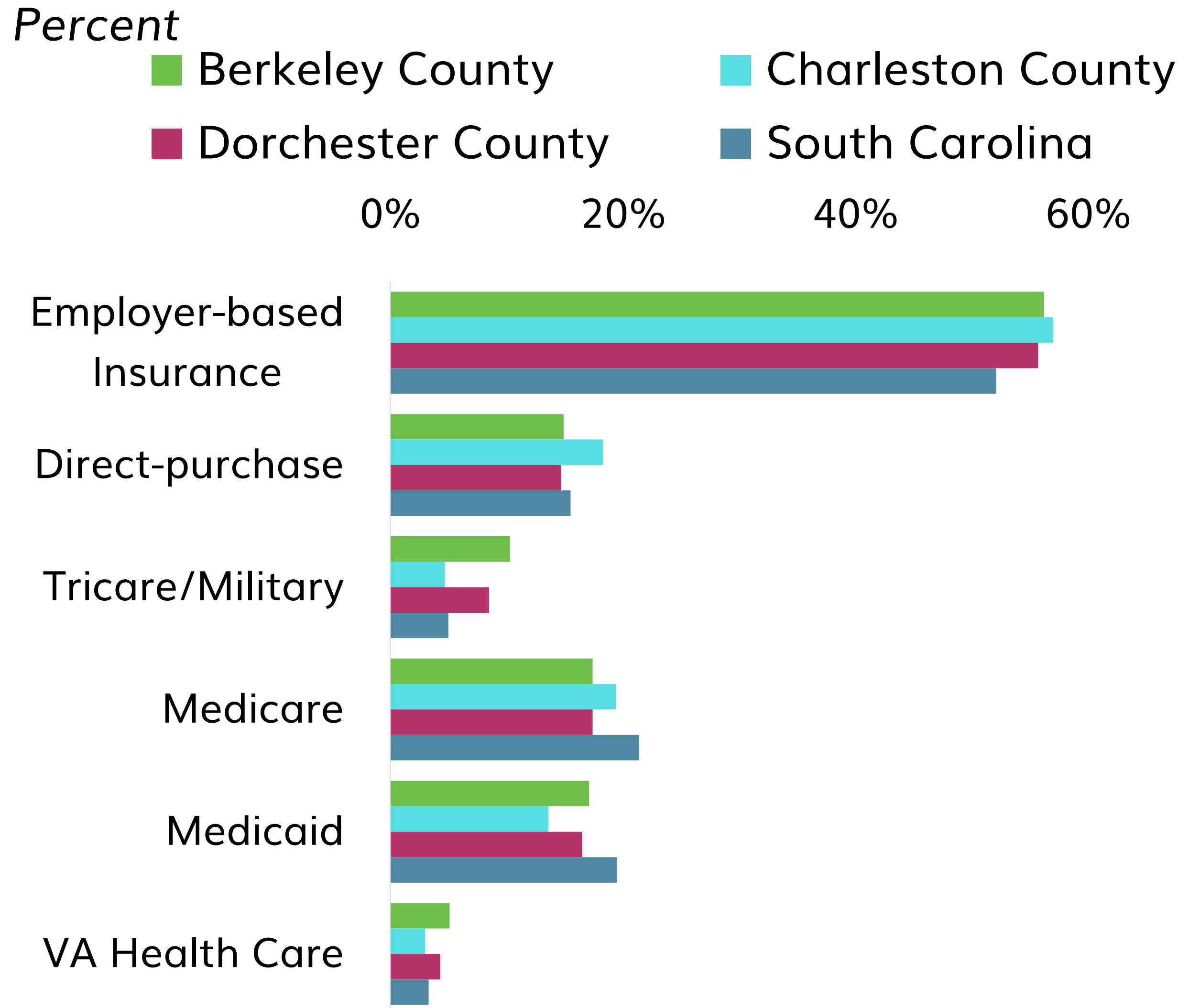


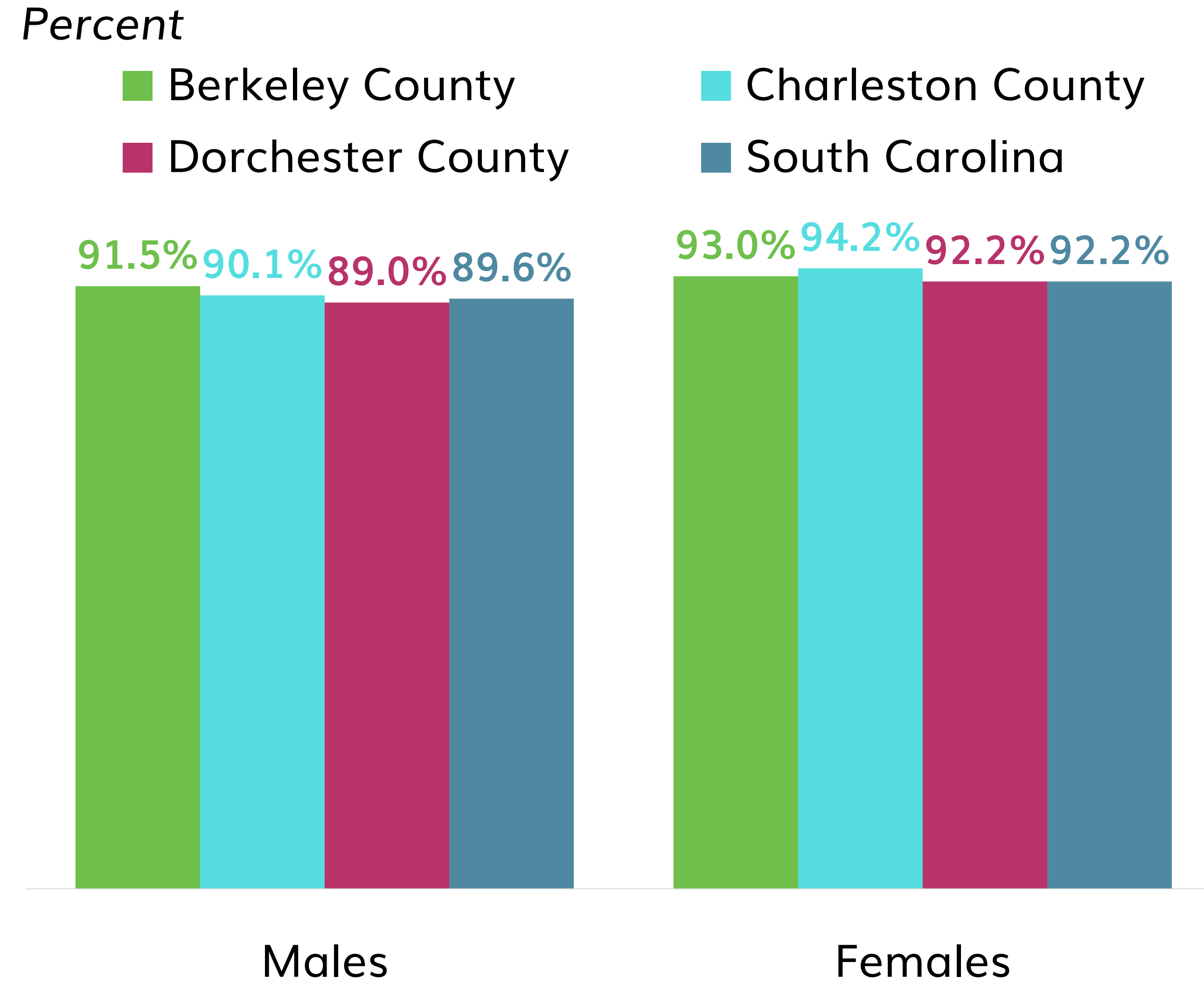

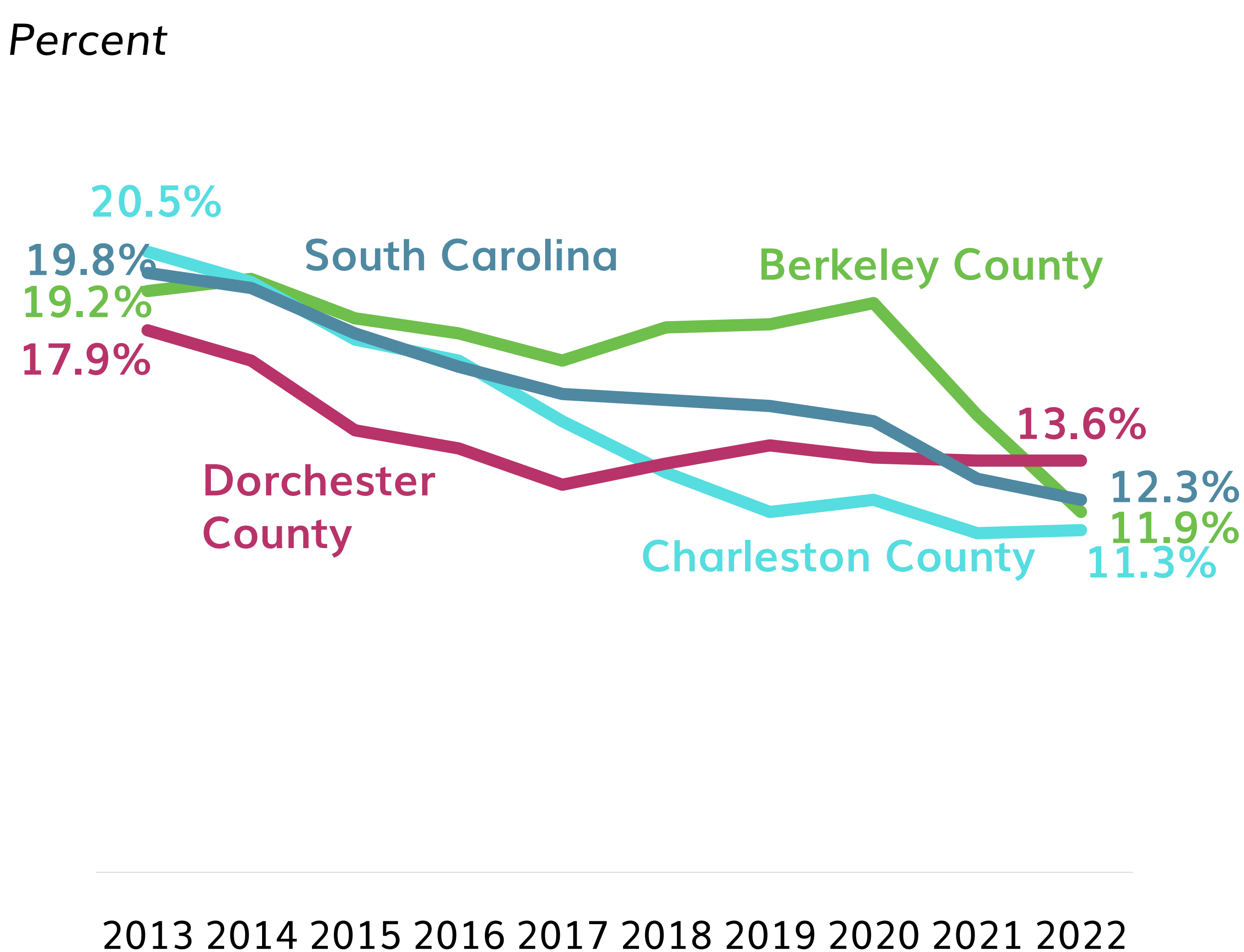
Health Care Insurance Among Adults, by Sex

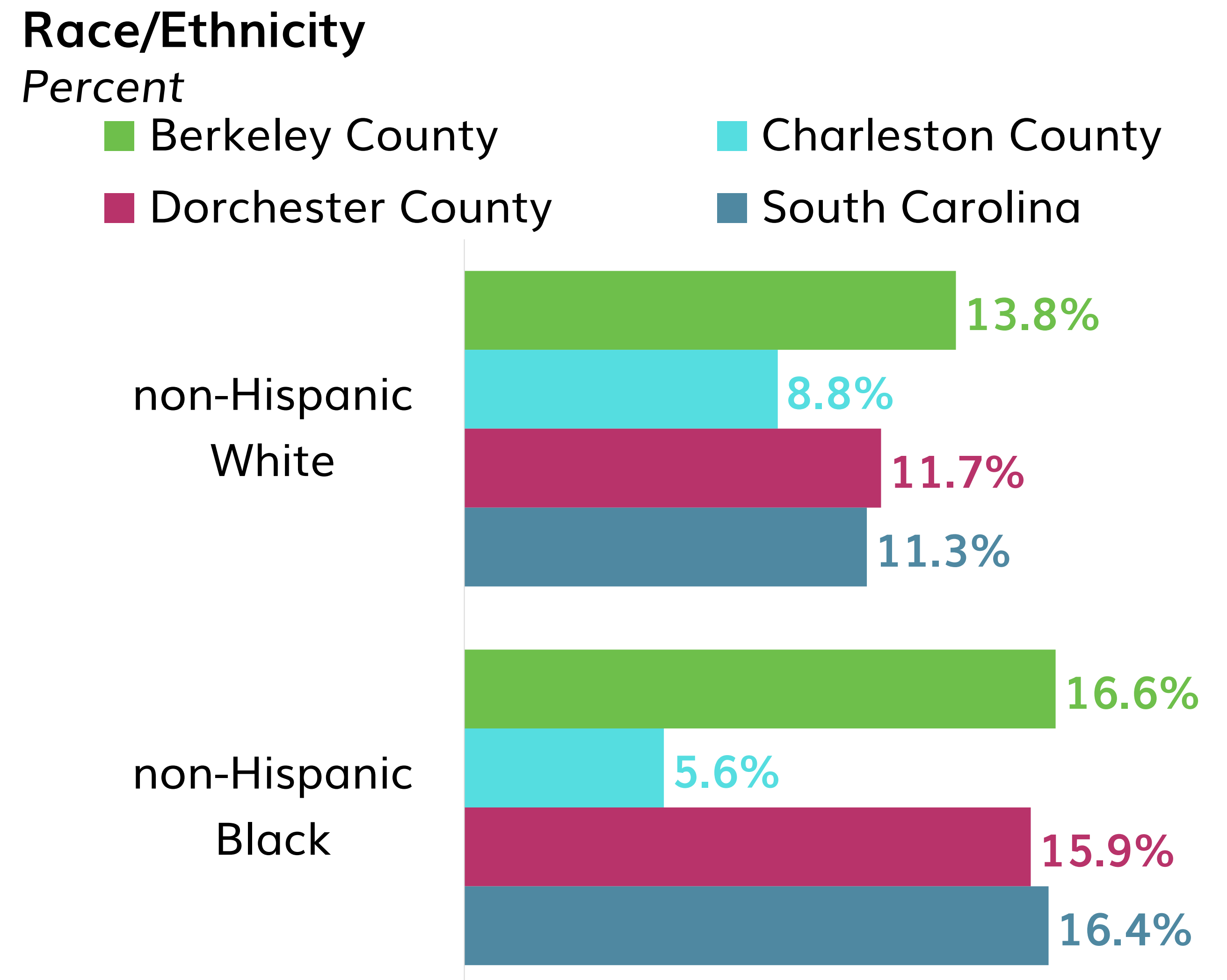

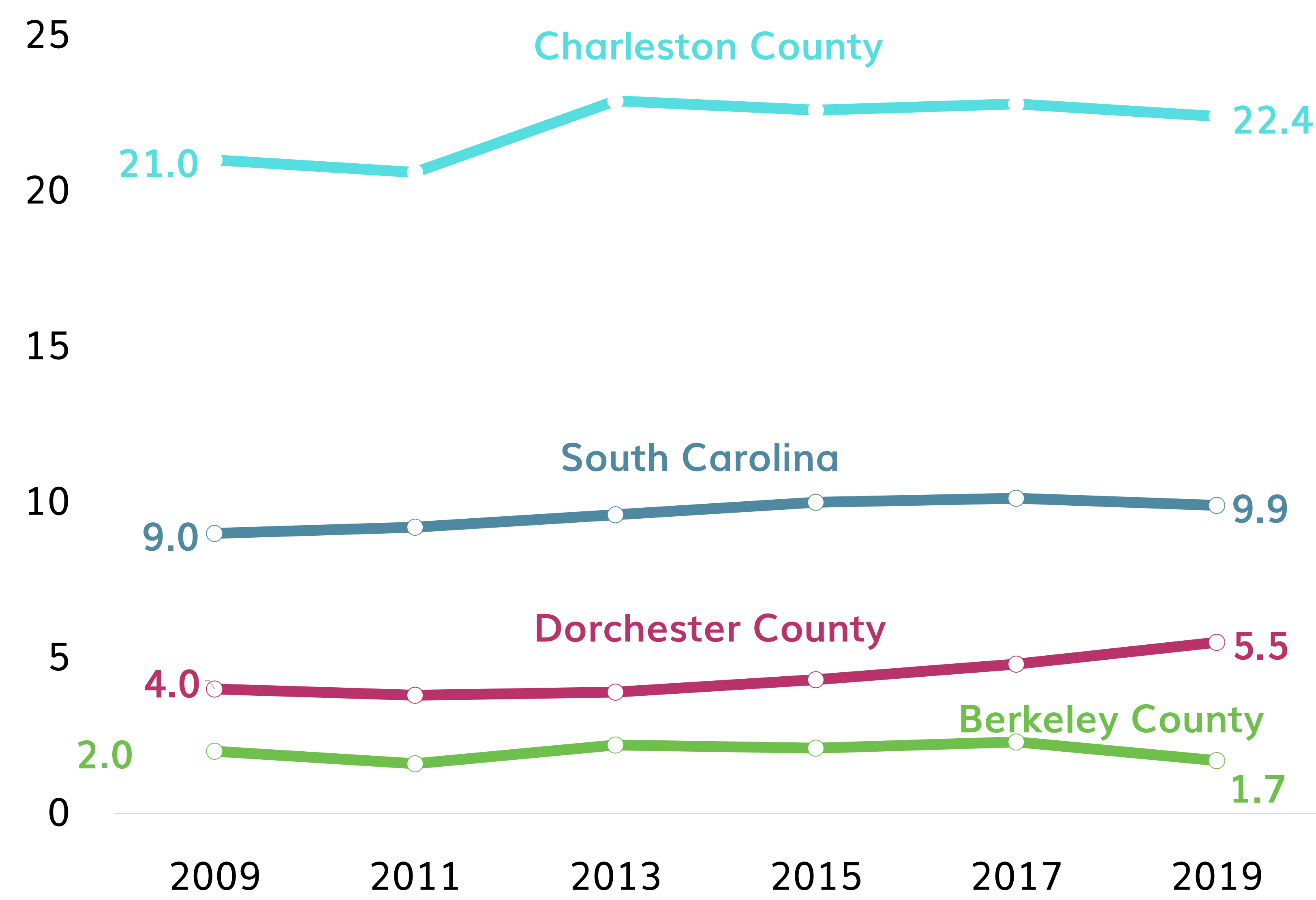

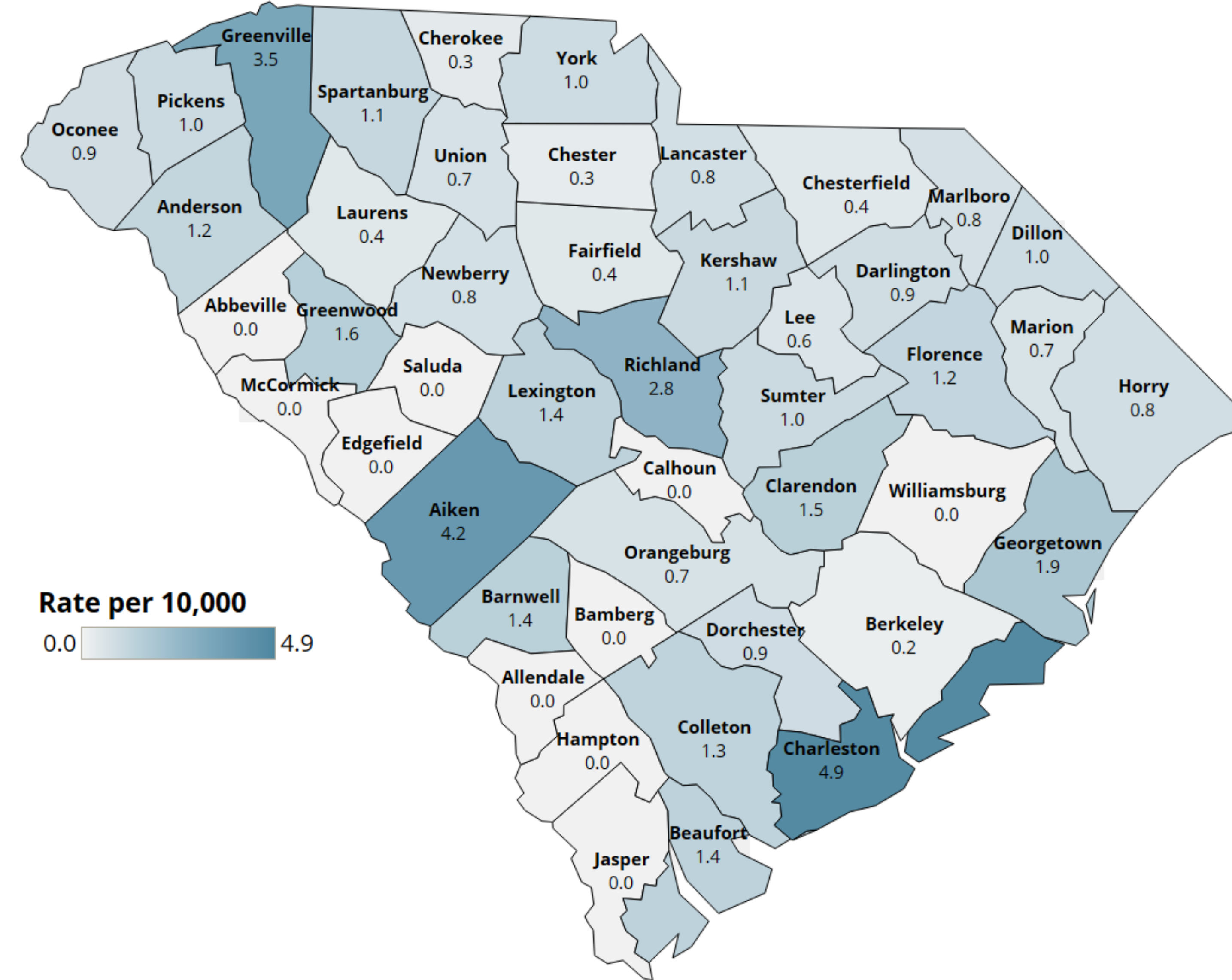

Rate per 10,000 population



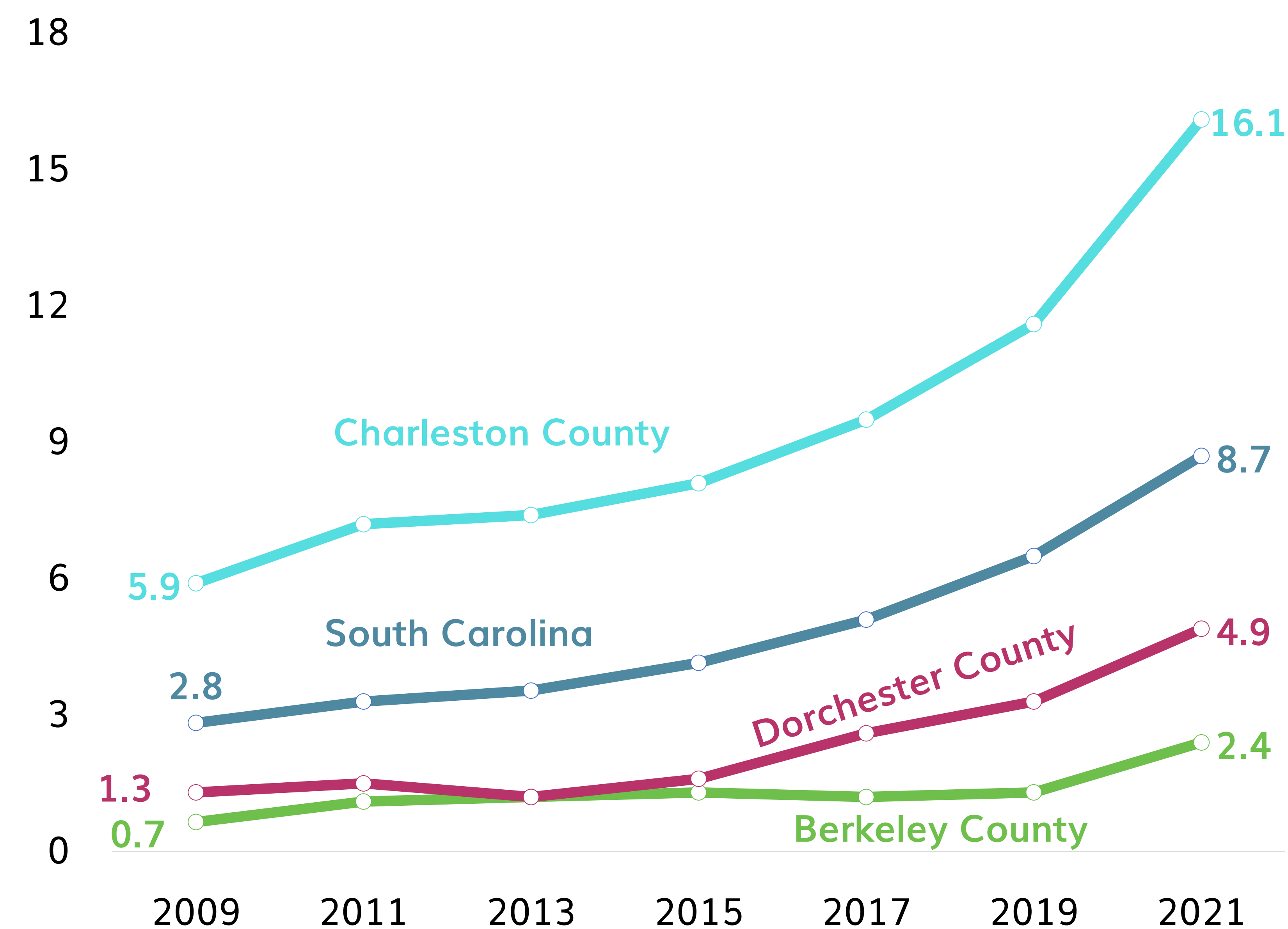

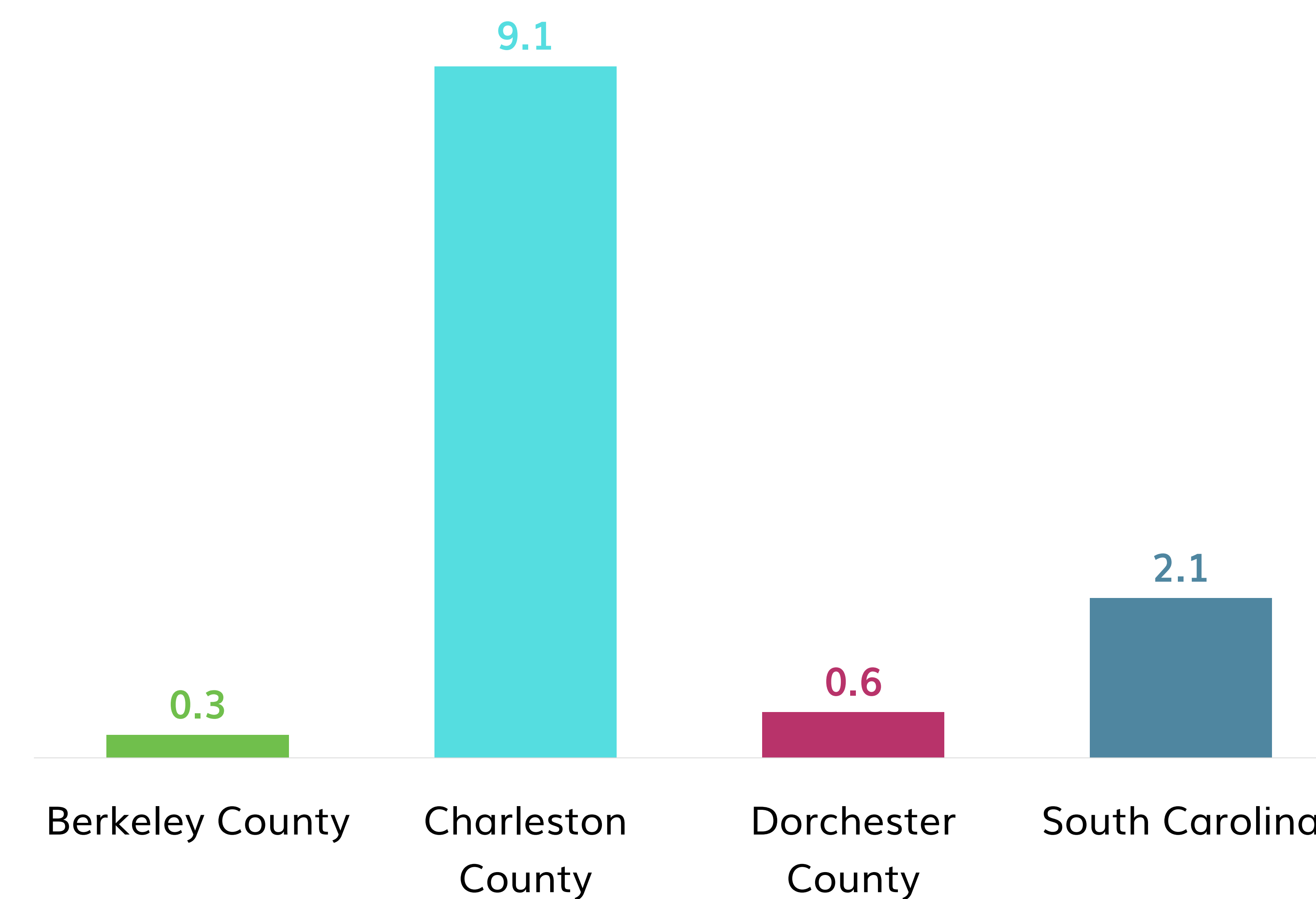

Rate per 10,000 Population



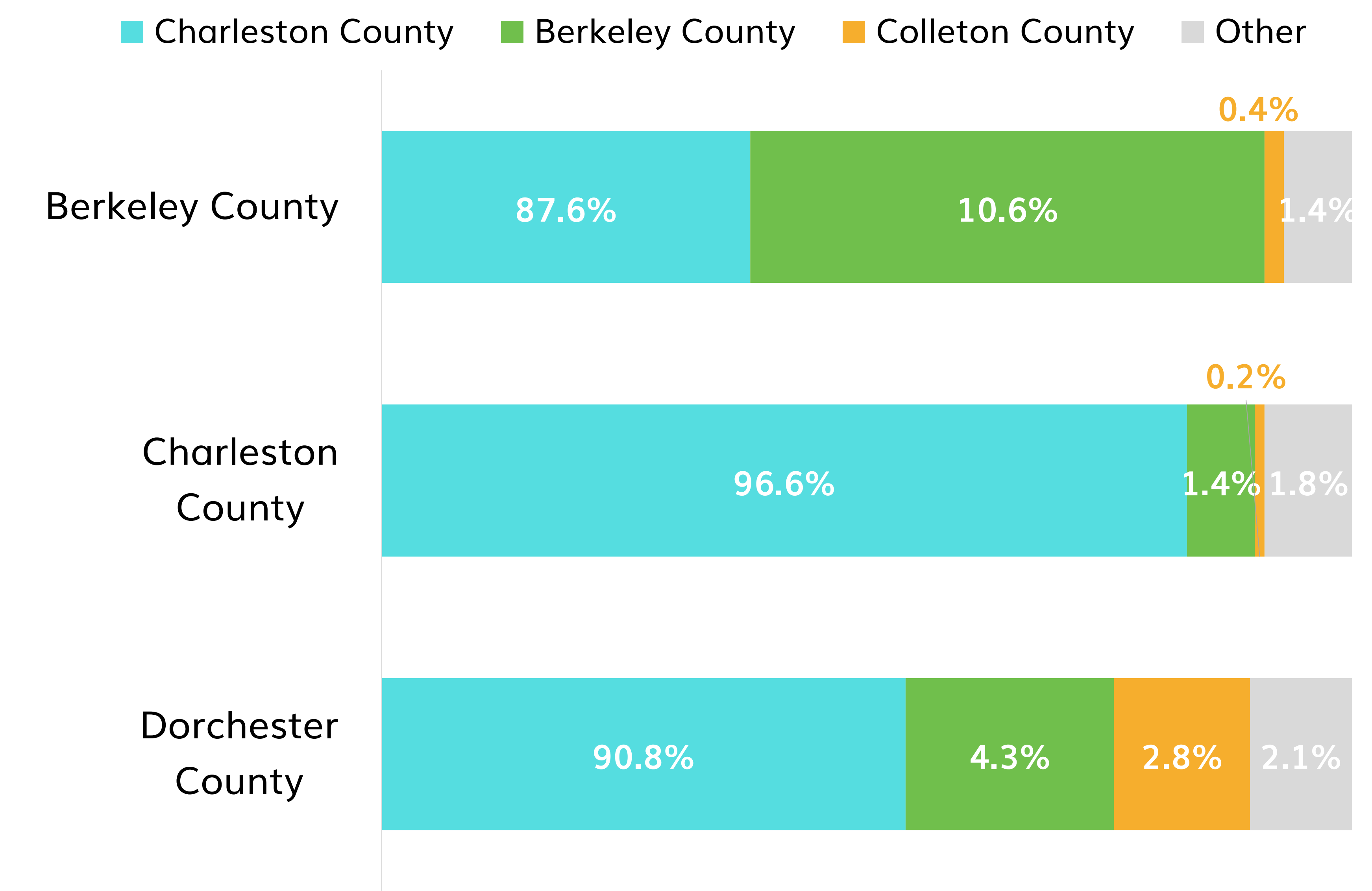

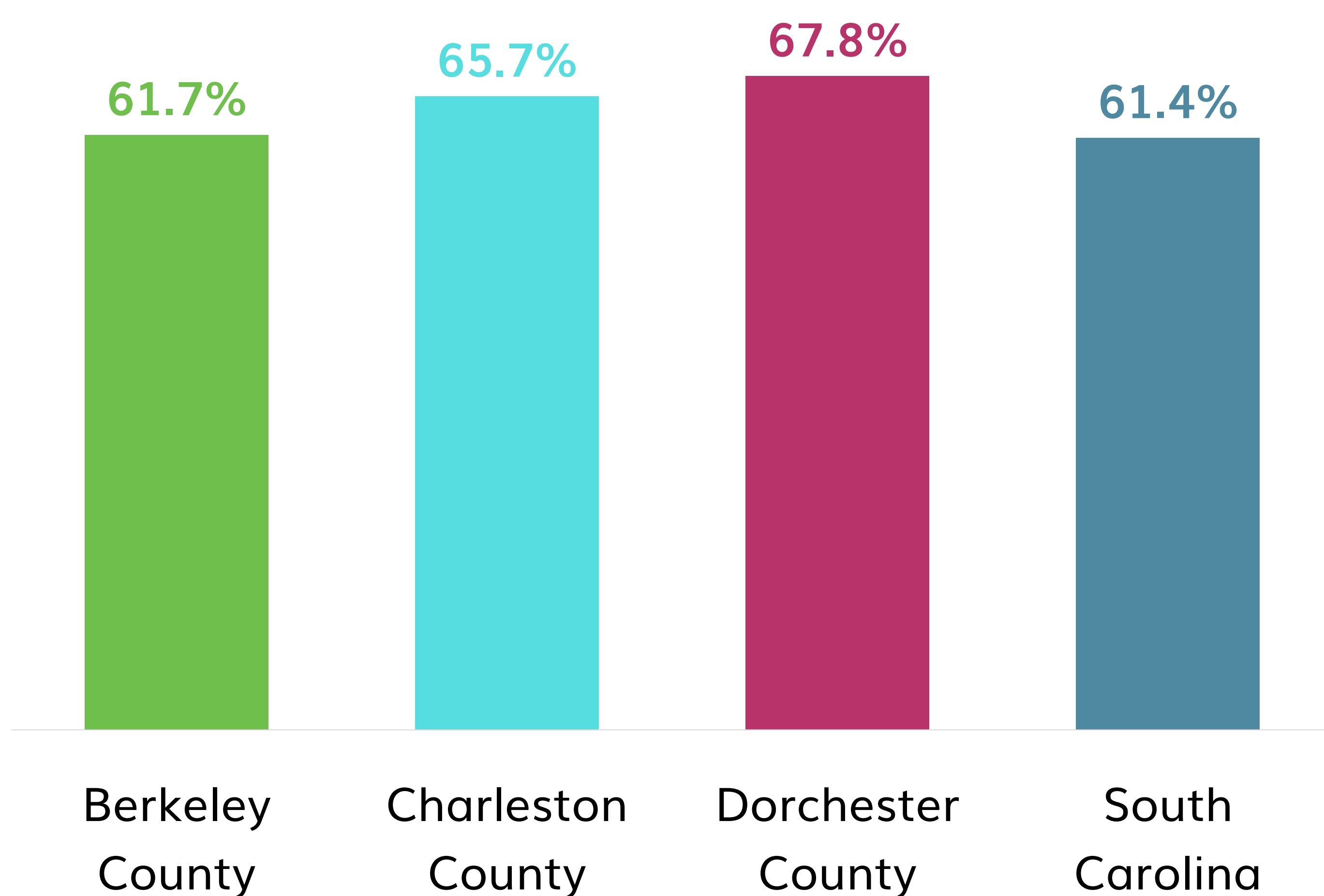
Location of Hospitalizations

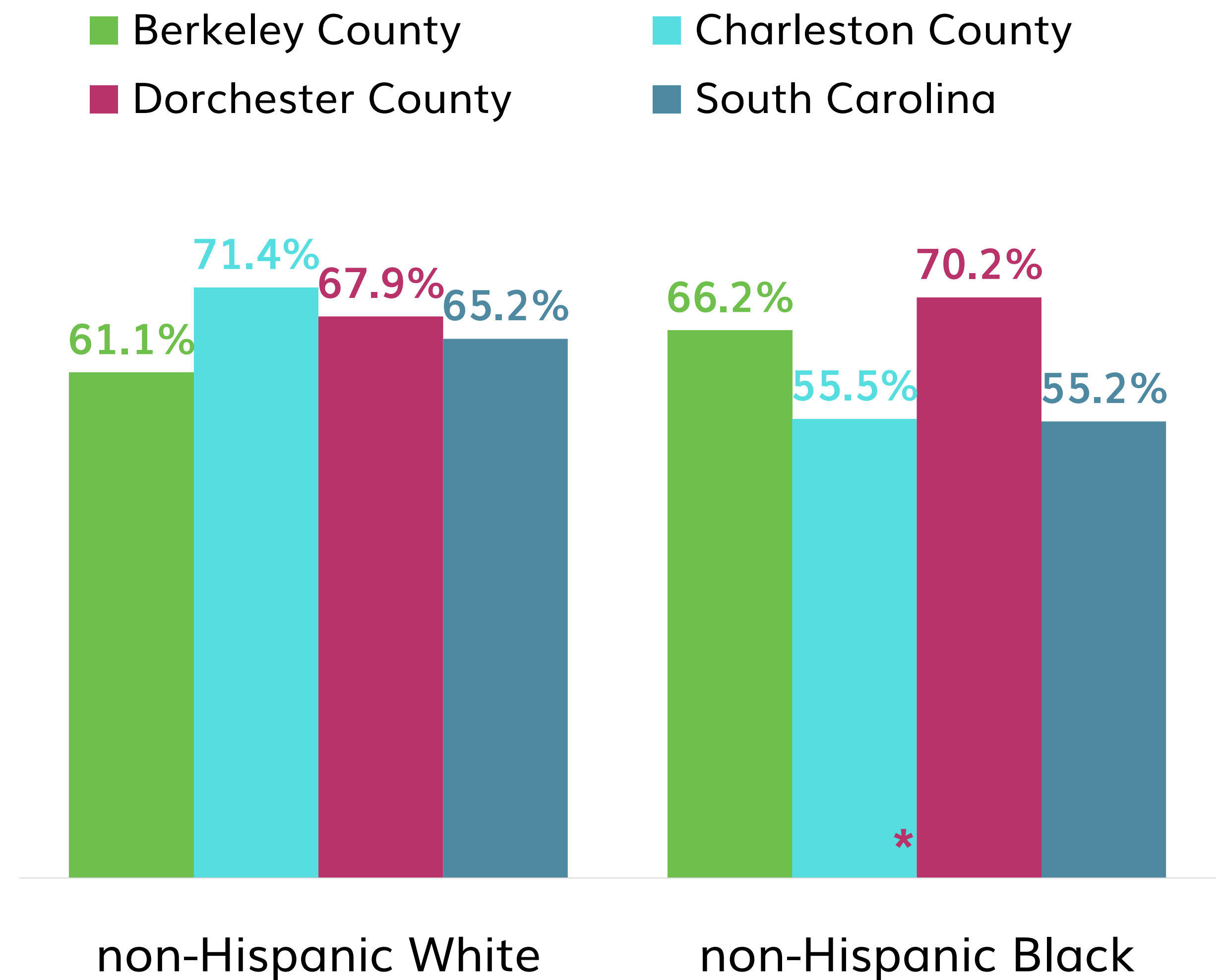

Percent

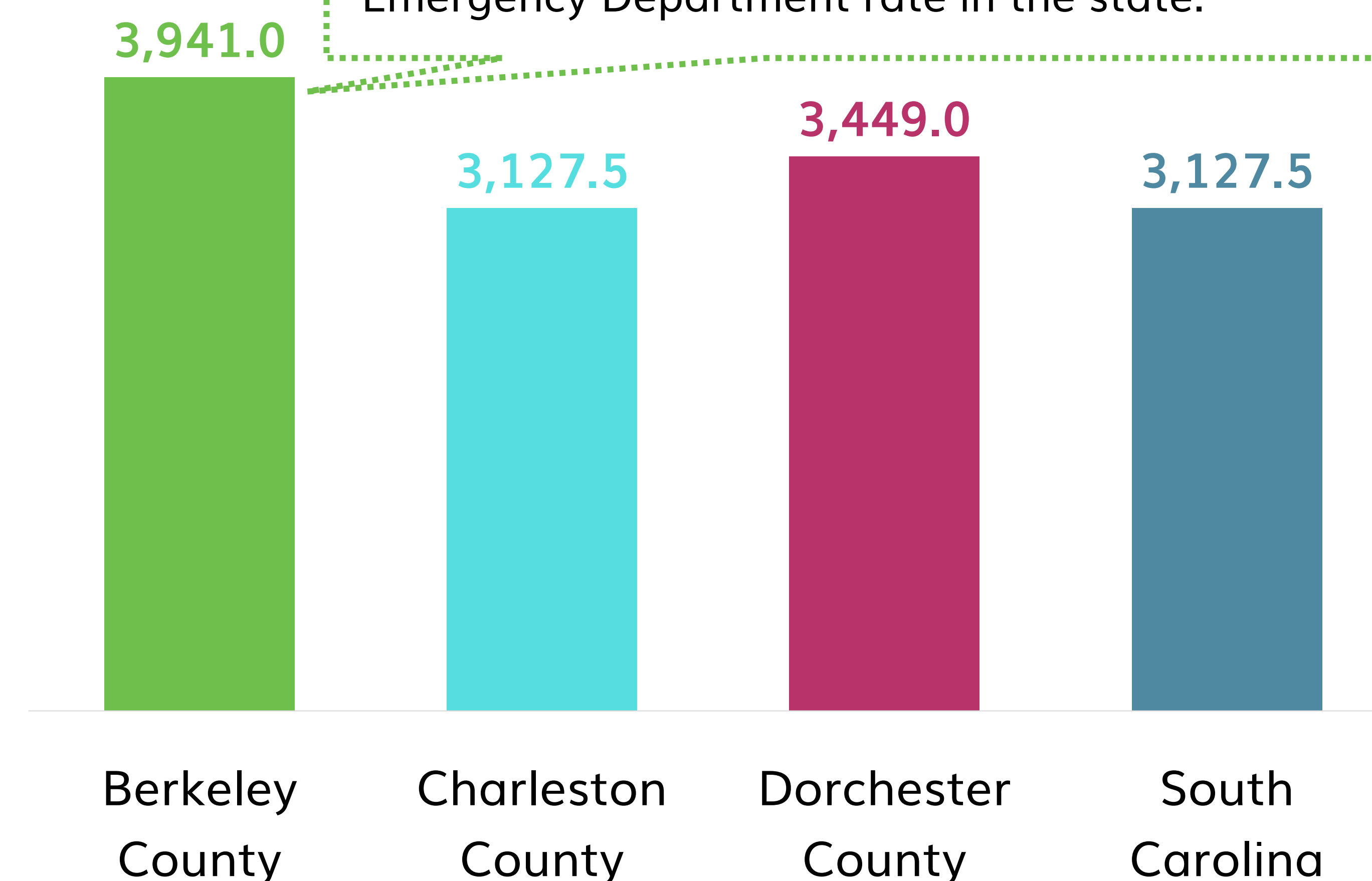

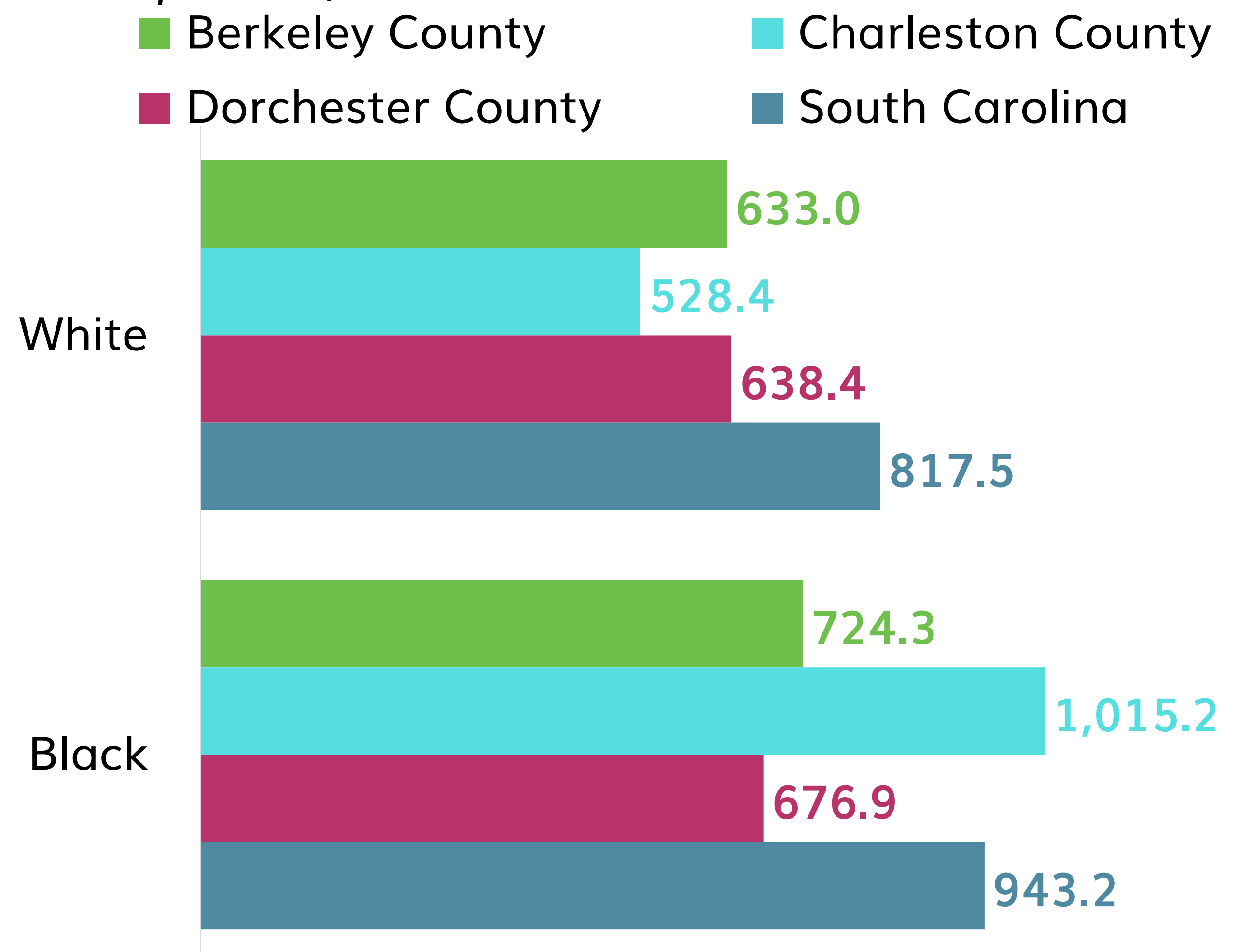
Avoidable Emergency Department Visits
