



Status of COVID-19: Where are we now?








COVID-19 in the Tri-County Area by Demographic Groups



Tri-County Population and COVID-19 Data, by Sex (As of 2/13/2021)




Tri-County Population and COVID-19 Data, by Race Groups (As of 2/13/2021)



Tri-County COVID-19 Data, by Age-Group (As of 2/13/2021)











South Carolina COVID-19 Vaccines Administered, by Sex (As of 2/13/2021)





South Carolina COVID-19 Vaccines Administered, by Age-Group (As of 2/13/2021)





South Carolina COVID-19 Vaccines Administered, by Race (As of 2/13/2021)






Willingness to Accept a Vaccine Falls on a Continuum



Rural Residents Most Resistant to COVID-19 Vaccination; Black, Hispanic Adults Most Likely to "Wait and See"


Percent who say they will get a COVID-19 vaccine:


Which Groups Are Most Likely To Be COVID-19 Vaccine Hesitant?




Essential Workers: Intention to Get the COVID-19 Vaccine

Factors weighing on acceptance:


Are there side effects?
