WHO IS ALICE ? ®

ALICE[®], an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed,

is a new way of <u>defining</u> and <u>understanding</u> the struggles of households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level, but not enough to afford basic necessities.



What is the ALICE Threshold?

ALICE

Households with income <u>above</u> the Federal Poverty Level but <u>below</u> the basic cost of living.

ALIĈE THRESHOLD:

The average income needed to afford the Household Survival Budget.

(ALICE + Federal Poverty Level = ALICE Threshold)

In South Carolina, 43% of households live on the verge of financial instability and struggle to meet basic needs.








Most Common Industries for Workers Below ALICE Threshold with Number of Workers and Average Full-Time Hourly Wage






Key Variable: Full-Time Workers Earning Enough for Household Survival Budget (1 Adult, 1 School-Age Child) by Race/Ethnicity





Homeownership, Households Below ALICE Threshold, by Race/Ethnicity








