



HTC HEALTH EQUITY PRINCIPLES


Health is more than healthcare- social conditions are just as important to health as medical care

Health is tied directly to the distribution of resources- the single strongest predictor of our health is our position on the class pyramid

Racism imposes an added health burdenongoing discrimination in housing, jobs and education

The choices we make are shaped by the choices we have- unhealthy behaviors are often shaped by unhealthy social and environmental factors







SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Social determinants of health are conditions in the environments in which people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.

Healthy People 2020

Social determinants of health are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age. These circumstances are shaped by the distribution of money, power and resources at global, national and local levels. The social determinants of health are mostly responsible for health inequities – the unfair and avoidable differences in health status seen within and between countries.


