
What is PrEP?



PrEP is a new prevention method in which **people who do not have HIV** infection **take a pill daily to reduce their risk** of becoming infected.



People who use PrEP must commit to taking the drug every day and seeing their health care provider every 3 months for follow-up. PrEP can only be prescribed by a health care provider and **must be taken as directed to work.**






There is now a pill that prevents HIV infection!

 - Patient Centered











Gender










Average Costs of PrEP Care

- Labs, Office Visits, Testing Supplies
- Uninsured: **\$1,145 per year**
- Does not include medication
- Does not include potential revenue from insured patients



Lessons Learned

- PrEP works! Zero HIV infections
- PrEP does not lead to 'risk compensation'
- PrEP patients are proactive, health conscious
- Increases HIV & STD testing & treatment
