The Problems

- The community seeks care in the ED, foregoing preventative care due to costs-when the ED is your only choice, you go to the ED
- Rising costs of care, declining reimbursement
- Lack of preventative care leads to higher ED and readmission rates



The Problems

- Jan-March 2017: 8.8% of Americans are uninsured
- Jan-March 2017: 4.3% of the population failed to seek out medical care due to costs
- We have had a 10% increase in the diagnosis of diabetes since last year giving us a percent of 10.5% of the population (18+)







The Impact
